Why is Transparency Important?

- Transparency builds trust that leadership is making good and balanced decisions
- Knowledge shared empowers everyone and Creates a Culture of Inclusion

 Shared knowledge leads to personal investment and buy in of a Shared Vision.

Transparency IS:

Ethically Required for Servant Leader

A process, whereby knowledge and ideas flow in all directions in a sustained and timely manner

Transparency is NOT...

- A pretext to gossip
- An excuse to treat others poorly
- A justification to betray a confidence or legally binding confidentiality

- An alternative for apologies
- A public confession
- A substitute for resolving a problem

What Does it Mean to Be Transparent?

- Obvious Motives and Intentions
- Demonstrate Honesty and Integrity
- Welcome positive and negative feedback
- Commitment to sharing information
- Answer questions publically
- Have nothing to hide



Strategies to Share Information

- 1. Access to information is required but not sufficient
- 2. Delivery methods varied, duplicative, and accessible (See 2.2. Authentic Reciprocal Communication)
- 3. Provide guide for the information (Insert video demonstrating how to find info on website during general assembly)
- 4. Build context to increase understanding and relevancy (see 3.4.Facilitating Consensus Building)
- 5. Understand Danger of Under-Communicating (Insert video John Kotter of the Harvard Business School.. https://www.voutube.com/watch?v=bGVe3wRKmH0)

- Staff and Board members contact available: telephone number, email/online form, and mailing address
- Mission statement and Bylaws available
- Minutes of meetings available
- Conduct and conflict of interest policies available
- Audited financial statements available
- IRS form 990-PF available
- Mechanisms to provide information and accept feedback available
- Information and Feedback shared with community
